18TH REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

SEPTEMBER 24 2019

The 18th Regular Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor James Waller after the Lord's Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance were said.

All Council Members present.

Mayor Waller introduce Philip Turske newly hired Village Administrator. He worked for the City of Lorain for seven years as a grant writer & project manager.

Guests: Donna Snyder, Patti Willoughby, Denise Freeland, Aaron Stoller & Chris Miller.

Denise Freeland announced the Octoberfest will be this weekend. Bob Harris is meeting with contractors to construct the ADA bathrooms. Demolition is complete. Denise announced events for the upcoming events to be held in the village. Councilman Boldizar stated he is asking for a friend, what time is the beer fest?

Police Chief Chris Miller presented his quarterly report. Chris is working with Loudon Ford regarding the purchase of a new police cruiser. The base price due to the new model the State Bid Price is approximately \$5000 higher than last year's model. The equipment package will be at least \$2500 more than the previous year. Chris was informed the equipment package will increase by 8-10% at the beginning of the year. The car could be ordered this year and paid for out of the 2020 budget. Councilman Tarbet asked if there were any options. Chris suggests the village stay with the Ford.

Fire Chief Stoller reported the current FEMA Grant – pressure test will take effect next week for the sprinkler system. Box installed to cover exposed piping. The Stark Marc System will upgraded effecting the county wide tower site. A cost of \$500,000. They had 61 busy outs and they feel that is too many. Safety meetings were held by the Fire department & schools. Aaron announced they have been awarded another FEMA Grant in the amount of \$279,000 from that the Fire Districts responsibility is \$13285.00 this will replace air packs and station modification to catch the diesel emissions from the trucks. A contract will have to put in place between the village and the district.

Motion to approve the Special Meeting held September 17 2019 was made by Councilman Tarbet seconded by Councilman Hannen. All voted yea.

Administrator: Mr. Turske stated he will interview for crossing guards on Wednesday.

Service Director: JT reported Street Dept.:

- Cut roadway on Hillview to install new storm sewer, materials have been ordered.
- Finished cleaning storm sewers on E. Lincoln Way.
- Assisted Waste Water in jetting sanitary sewer on Prospect to Vine St.
- Cut McDowell for Water Dept. project.
- Champion 10,000/8,000 Watt generator for street department estimate: \$1,049.00 through Lowes

Water Dept.:

- Replaced 2" Water Main on McDowell west of Queen St. 09/20 and 09/23.
- Water leak in East Lawn Cemetery 09/24/19.
- Reviewed EPA letter about sanitary survey on 08/13/19. Violations noted were:
 - 1. Production Well #1 has been out of service since 1986 for unknown reasons. This violation was brought up during 2016 Sanitary Survey. EPA ordered well either be abandoned and sealed or put back online.
 - 2. Panic hardware was not installed on entry/exit door of Chlorine Room per the plans submitted to the EPA.

	Patti Willoughby stated the computers will have to be upgraded to Windows 10. Windows 7 will no longer have the updates or security. The credit card processing company informed the village as of January 1 Windows 10 will have to be in place or credit cards cannot be accepted. Patti has a quote from SSI. She also received a quote on the server, but we don't have to act on that but will have to be installed by the end of January. The quote will be prepared for the next meeting. Councilman Tarbet asked if the village could change to Square, but Patti stated there would be fees and right now there are no fees only to the customer.

	Councilman Tarbet stated he has been contacted by a few residents regarding the cut that was made on Hillview for the drain. They are concerned it is going to cause more problems with other residents and we need to re-examine if that thing is far enough up the hill. The calls are still saying there is still water runoff above where you cut and doing damage to driveways. JT received a call from a resident. JT stated the storm sewer being installed we are trying to keep the water from flowing down the driveways into the backyards and flooding. We are trying to catch it before the driveways. JT stated the top of the hill is another issue. I have not been there when it rains. Councilman Tarbet stated so we are going to further look at this problem. They questioned you stated Councilman Tarbet. So we have done part of it and don't exclude people when we have done it for the rest of the street. Councilman Tarbet stated the information for the generator. What concerns me is the service ability, I know that particular retailer does not support anything on repair, they send you elsewhere. Is there a local repair person. JT stated there are several in Canton. That would be my only concern stated Councilman Tarbet.
