	Service Director Williams was able to get quotes for the property on Murray Ave. with the water issue in his garage. The boring would be about \$2,000. for 125 feet, approximately \$1,600. for pipe and about \$300. for the catch basin for an approximate total of \$3,900. There is also sidewalk damage from one of our trees on Penn St. Our ordinances say that the homeowner is responsible for the sidewalks. Administrator Turske noted that we're getting in to a lot of moral claims and we don't have a sidewalk program in place. We need to be	

careful about setting a precedent.
