	Discussion-Aaron asked if he may ask a question. So, nothing in that ordinance is going to fix a waterline. That whole \$300,000 is going for water meter replacement? So how does that need an emergency? Don't they already owe you how many meters from \$78000 you already have set aside to full fill the order from last year. If this is all going to water meter readers remote testing his reason for emergency is for replacing piping. That is not what this ordinance says. Clark is that correct you are not replacing piping? But the whole ordinance says replacing meters. You are having this one emergency reading with no input from the village and spend all \$300000 of ARPA Funds in one night passed as an emergency. I don't think its right! I think it a way around input. We all know what the biggest complaint in this town is. The water lines. This isn't replacing a water line. Not a single one of those \$300000 is for a waterline its all for meters. Att. Battista stated the expedited enhancement of water revenue collection would position the village to replace water lines. Councilman Boldizar stated that's
	how it was sold to us. Aaron stated ARPA Funds do not need spent until 2024, so it not like its an emergency! Phil stated \$380,000 would replace essentially one water line of a decent size. Aaron stated I agree. But if you correct your revenue enhancement portion and correct and do accurate billing, we could put people on a monthly billing cycle. It could help the residence be a more friendly

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billing cycle. We could increase the fund and start replacing more lines. We are doing one to one and a half water lines a year. With increasing that fund we will be able to after more loans and grants and start leveraging our money better. Aaron stated you have to look from the resident, tax payer stand point Mr. Turske. This Everything on the agenda tonight I have heard is an emergency, so there is no public input. I get the budget. The time we got a grant that we didn't know we had to have three reads to get turned back. That doesn't sit right with me as a taxpayer. Phil asked which grant. Aaron responded the Visit Canton Grant. Phil stated loudly that is not on us that is on them, so please don't throw that at their face, because they gave us a short turn around. We got that a week and a half ago! Do not use that as an example for this!! If you are the person sitting here tonight and not being explained to what is the perception asked Aaron. The perception is everything is being passed without public input and this to me, I get what you are saying, I understand revenue collection, but the way that reads it states meters not pipe replacement. So, it's a discussion as a taxpayer I just don't think that reads properly. Phil stated if you read the entire thing yes you are correct, but if you read all of it is explaining it is enhancing the revenue. Councilman Boldizar stated that's how we took it in the discussion. Aaron stated I am not a fan of emergency measures because it takes away the public input. Councilman Boldizar stated I agree, but with one meeting left in the fiscal year is the reason we are seeing a lot of emergency reads. Phil stated the water meter replacement project isn't going to happen next year. Aaron stated because they owe you meters from last year, correct? Phil stated which we are going to get to. Phil stated about this we have to bring on a consultant to evaluate where we are at and what needs done is going to take time. Then you have to bid out the project. The installation. We are looking at 2024 if we are lucky. Aaron stated this discussion helps explain that. However, just pushing it through a term I will use, without a good explanation doesn't sit well with people at home that post on FB every time their water is brown. Until we fix those its never going to go away. From what I have heard, hidden in the budget right if my water line still (yelling back & forth) Aaron stated let me finish my comment Phil. When people find out there is going to be a sign on the corner and their water is still brown, and I get part of that money is coming from a grant, but Mason how do you look at that person and tell them that was a better way of spending money to enhance the corner than fixing water lines to have clean water or our community building we are going to inherit that is falling apart. These are all things in the community people have to understand. Perception is not always good. If we do something that looks as beautification and our water lines are still not good, I get it. This back and forth here of what this truly means is good explanation for people watching on YouTube. But, just to read something and move it through. I get the time lines. I just think better explanation is all that it needs! I don't want to use hidden in the budget. I take offense to that stated Phill I apologize stated Aaron. I just ask for a better explanation stated Aaron. Councilman Boldizar stated Aaron I will be very honest with you. I voted for your wife when she ran due to her being very vocal on water in the village and I think it is still an issue. To me this is a way to help that issue. Replacing the meters is the first step to apply for grants, billing our residents stated Councilman Boldizar. Aaron asked if the consultant to be hired will have a plan to show the public. Is this revenue going to allow the village to hire a consultant that will have a plan to say we are going to do 2000 feet of pipe every year. I understand this will with cost and so on. If we are going to guarantee every year a 1000 foot of pipe every year there is a dim light at the end of the tunnel that will get brighter every year goes by. Look how long fluctuate. Union went with patching. We need a better road map as to how we get there! We have to let the people know better via social media however this is the plan. Councilman Boldizar stated we have that plan; I feel the communication is the problem. We can all do a better job at that. We realize that there are issues with waterlines. Councilman Boldizar stated we did a great job on N. Market. Aaron stated, but look where the complaints are coming from. The complaints are not coming from those areas. McDaniel Allotment is a place we have not worked on. They are the loudest people getting everyone else stirred up. I get it different areas qualify for CDBG money determines funding. I remember the project on Murray. Residence did not fill out the paperwork to determine the funding and the project stopped. As fire chief I benefit from new water lines. We have to get rid of the 4-inch lines. As a tax payer I am asking it is communicated better. I feel if we would publicize the agendas to let residents know what is on that would be beneficial.
