## 14TH REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

JULY 25<sup>TH</sup>, 2023

The  $14^{\rm th}$  Regular Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor Timothy N. Tarbet after the Pledge of Allegiance & The Lord's Prayer were said.

All Council Members present.

Guests: Duane Fuehrig- Mad River & NKP RR Museum, Amanda Cullhove, Patti Willoughby.

Mr. Fuehrig is accepting ownership of the caboose and moving it to the Mad River & NKP RR Museum located in Bellevue, Ohio. Bellevue was one of the first cities in Ohio to receive rail service. The rail yard in Bellevue is the second largest in North America. In 2015 we started a Christmas themed fundraising event we call the Holiday Train. We have two cabooses full of passengers for a ten-minute ride through the coach yard. Passengers then have cookies and hot chocolate and visit with Santa in the 1927 dining car. Due to the popularity of this event the need for another caboose is a necessity. We plant to restore your NYC caboose to operational condition within the next few months. It should be running by Thanksgiving. The car will not be completely restored by that time, but we will clean it up and make it look the best we can. The attraction to the Minerva caboose was the right of way we use is a NYC main line. There is a very good possibility that caboose traveled on that right of way during its career. Everyone at the museum thanks everyone for making this happen! Councilman Boldizar asked what year the caboose is. Mr. Fuehrig stated 1952. Mayor Tarbet stated he hopes something is placed on the caboose stating where it came from. Mr. Fuehrig welcomes council members and their families to come to Bellview to ride the Holiday Train! Removal of the caboose could happen tomorrow.
