Jt stated we could possibly look into caution pedestrian signs. Mr. Gunderson stated if we want a crosswalk that would require a traffic study. That would determine if that would be feasible. I would presume they would say there is a crosswalk a block up or another by the pool you could use. Mr. Gunderson stated we can reach out to ODOT to see if it could be recommended. John asked if you guys are going to do nothing, what are you going to do when the next time it could be fatal and you may have a law suite on your hands? Councilman Boldizar stated I don't think we would have a lawsuit! You are at fault, right? That's what the prosecutor said stated John. I was trying to get across the street, how can he say I was at fault? There was no crossw

If you would have gone to the legal crosswalk you would not have been hit stated Mayor Tarbet. John replied exactly! Mayor Tarbet stated I am not judging you in any manner, we will make some phone calls to the state. I was told after therapy and when I healed up to tell the city. I hope to God you do something with it! Don't you think this is more important than fixing up the park? There all sorts of different levels of priorities.
