12TH REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

JUNE 24, 2025

The 12th Regular Council Meeting was called to order by Mayor Mason J. Boldizar after the Pledge of Allegiance and the Lord's Prayer were said.

Mayor Boldizar congratulated Mr. Crouse on his induction into the Alumni Hall of Fame.

Motion to approve the Minutes of the 11th Regular Council Meeting held June 10th, 2025 was made by Councilman Meadows seconded by Councilman Harris. All voted yea.

Administrator: Mr. Mytinger announced the staff apparel project has been completed. The Homecoming was an outstanding event and I congratulate the committee and Nate. I started a committee to create a youth triathlon. We may table it to next year's Homecoming. Mr. Mytinger presented the poster advertising the Discover Minerva App. The posters will be places at various businesses throughout town. Downloading the app will allow residents to keep updated on what is going on around Minerva. The signage will be finalized and approved and in production and hopefully the signs will be delivered in July.

Service Director: Street Dept.: Weeds trimmed PD Lot, and municipal lots on Short and S. Market. Replaced rear door seal on sweeper. Mowed nuisance property on Elizabeth. Mosquito spraying Tuesday & Wednesday. Riser installed on Almeda. Need to concrete. Funerals as needed. Removed water on E. 1st St. following rain events.

Water Dept: Replaced service line on E. High St. Need to restore sidewalk. Preparing for metric reporting.

Wastewater Dept: Received Minerva Dairy reporting for May 2025. Press sludge pump is down, electrical issue damaged pump and wiring, repairs underway.

Park Dept: Homecoming set up and tear down. Rotary Park infield. Bruh hogged creek banks. Pulled weeds around Village Hall. Replaced leaking hydraulic line on Jacobson mower. Replaced throttle line on Kubota ZD331 mower.

Zoning: Nuisance: See activity & summary report. Permits: See permit report 44 YTD.

Finance Director: Patti stated the village for some odd reason has received a large sum of Municipal and net profit taxes from a local factory for 2023. We have already refunded them. So why they are paying this additional I do not know, nor does the State. So, it looks like we have collected 78.5 % of our income tax budget, but we will probably have to refund that.

Police Chief: Chief Gardner reported for the month of May the department received 340 calls for service, 92 traffic stops, 42 citations, completed 47 incident reports, 13 arrests were made for the month. Officer May & Clunen was given accommodation letters. Officer May for his efforts in investigating several reports which were not his and completing search warrants for those reports. Sergeant Clunen received his accommodation for a traffic result that resulted in identifying a juvenile who was reported missing and in danger out of Youngstown. The department was able to secure the juvenile. Officers received their new ballistic vest. The cost totaled \$9481.60 we will be reimbursed by the State for \$7111.20. This is a result of a grant file in January. We are advertising for full & part time positions. Chief Gardner & Officer May put on a training class with Minerva Credit Union discussing robberies. July 9 the same class will be given to CNB. Saturday -Stockers & Streeters will be hosting their car show. Three WWII Veterans will be driving through the car show. Flags will be provided to the citizens in honor of the veterans. Mayor Boldizar asked he relay to Sergeant Clunen & Officer May during Mayors Court they are such a huge help. Kim also does a great job. I thank them every Wednesday, but they kind of blow me off, but they are appreciated.
